	Size explanation for Cumberland River Compact exhibit
	<ul> <li>Mini = smaller than 8x10 (less than 80 sq. in.)</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Medium = 8x10 and up to but not including 16x20 (from 80 to 319 sq. in.)</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Large = 16x20 and larger (320 sq. in. and greater)</li> </ul>

- There will be a <u>limit of 3 paintings-medium/mini size or 2 if one of the</u>
  <u>submissions is large</u> for this exhibit. Depending on submissions, your paintings may be rotated in and out over the course of the 4 weeks of exhibition.
- Image submission is crucial for wide visibility and sales opportunities for this show. Artists may submit an additional 7-8 images for a total of 10 images to be included in the sales gallery hosted by the CRC. Images must be direct, cropped for image only, no glare, no frame included images. Please submit images to Tiffany Foss to be added to the CRC gallery. Images must be of Cumberland River Watershed area and be in .jpg format and titles in the following format if they are not, they will not be added to the gallery.

Also required for submission – contact information – cell phone/home phone. Painters agree to hold these paintings as available for sale until November 11. Splits for all sales will follow the The Chestnut Group standard splits – 45%/45%/10%.

Please refrain from using heavy frames on the paintings.

# ⇒ 100% Donated Paintings

 Maximum size of 12x14, and there is no limit on the number of donated paintings.

#### □ Subject Matter

 The subject matter for all of the paintings submitted for this show (including 100% donated paintings) must be from the Cumberland River Basin territory

- Solid wood construction
- Since we are a plein air painting organization, plein air style frames are recommended, but not required (Google "plein air frames images" for examples.) Floater frames are acceptable.
- Gold, silver, bronze, black, single tone wood, neutral colored painted frames acceptable
- All others, including gallery-wraps, distressed wood, and low-quality frames not acceptable
